1. Dendrobium speciosum complex species.
2. Dendrobium kingianum.
3. Dendrobium aemulum, falcorostrum, gracilicaule, tetragonum complex, & any other Dendrobium species.
4. Dockrillia (Dendrobium Rhizobium) species
5. Sarcochilus and Sarcanthinae species.
6. Any other Australian species
7. Australasian species (including terete leaved) (Non Australian).
8. First flowering species seedling (excludes Dendrobium speciosum complex) (includes Australasian).
9. Dendrobium kingianum, best group of three distinct colours.
10. First flowering Dendrobium speciosum complex species or hybrid seedling (refer to condition 18).
11. Terrestrial Genera species.
12. Dendrobium speciosum complex hybrids (exhibition style) (refer Condition 17).
13. Dendrobium X gracillimum. X suffusum & Bardo Rose
14. Dendrobium X delicatum.
15. "Classic Hybrid" (refer to Condition 15).
16. Dendrobium hybrids with Phalaenanthe and/or Spatulata parentage – predominantly yellow/orange.
17. Dendrobium hybrids with Phalaenanthe and/or Spatulata parentage – predominantly pink/red/mauve.
18. Dendrobium hybrids with Phalaenanthe and/or Spatulata parentage – predom. white with an overlay.
19. Dendrobium hybrids with Phalaenanthe and/or Spatulata parentage – predom. any other colour mix.
20. Other Dendrobium hybrids – predominantly yellow/orange.
21. Other Dendrobium hybrids – predominantly pink/red/mauve.
22. Other Dendrobium hybrids – predominantly white with an overlay.
23. Other Dendrobium hybrids – predominantly any other colour mix.
24. Dockrillia (Dendrobium Rhizobium) hybrids – predominantly red/purple (Australian and Australasian)
25. Dockrillia (Dendrobium Rhizobium) hybrids – predom. yellow/orange (Australian and Australasian)
26. Dockrillia (Dendrobium Rhizobium) hybrids – predom. any other colour (Australian and Australasian)
27. All other Australasian hybrids (must have some Australasian parentage).
28. Sarcochilus and Sarcanthinae hybrids – predominantly white/cream/yellow
29. Sarcochilus and Sarcanthinae hybrids – predominantly any other colour
30. First flowering hybrid seedling – as per Classes 16, 17, 18, 19.
31. First flowering hybrid seedling – as per Classes 20, 21, 22, 23.
32. First flowering hybrid seedling – all other seedlings (includes Australasian).
33. First flowering Dockrillia (Dendrobium Rhizobium) hybrid seedling
34. Terrestrial Hybrids.
35. Bulbophyllum & other Epiphytic Genera hybrids.
36. Novice Class – Any Native Species (Refer condition 22).
37. Novice Class – Any Native Hybrid (Refer condition 22)

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

1. All sections cover Australian/Australasian orchids only. No exhibit is to be garnished by any other plant (eg: moss) other than that which is naturally occurring on the exhibit. No exotic plant or other material is to be present on the exhibit.
2. Entries of exhibits shall be free. Exhibits to be benched by 7.00pm on Thursday 18 August 2016. Judging to commence by 7.30pm.
3. All exhibits must be free of pests, diseases and viruses. Every plant must be labeled clearly.
4. Classes may be split, rearranged and removed at the Show Marshals' discretion. The staging of all plants, rejecting, organising and positioning is only at the direction of the Show Marshals. The Show Marshals' decisions are final and binding.
5. All growers who are financial members of ANOS Inc and ANOS Inc Groups or affiliated societies are eligible to enter.
6. ANOS Inc judging standards apply. The judges' decision shall be final and binding.
7. **Grand Champion:** Shall be selected from all first prize winners (Except Class 8).
8. **Reserve Champion:** Shall be selected from the remaining first prize winners and the exhibit placed second to the Grand Champion in its class.
9. **Classes 1, 10 & 12:** Shall be eligible for the Reg Burns Perpetual Trophy.
10. **Champion Specimen:** Shall be selected from all exhibits at the discretion of the judges.
11. **Classes 8, 10, 30, 31, 32 & 33:** Definition of a seedling
– A seedling shall mean a plant (being a whole clone)

- undivided) flowering for the first time since being raised from seed. For exhibition purposes, seedlings shall retain their status of seedlings through the flowering season in which they are first exhibited at a show, meeting or award judging. (These classes are eligible for the Best Species, Hybrid seedling awards).
12. No prizes shall be given if in the judges' opinion a prize is not warranted.
 13. ANOS Inc Central Coast Group will not be responsible for any loss, damage or destruction to plants and no exhibitor or seller shall have any claim against the society but all reasonable care will be taken.
 14. Exhibits must not be removed from benches before the termination of the show, except with the authority of the Show Marshals.
 15. **Class 15: "Classic Hybrid"** means any native hybrid registered prior to 1985, excluding those hybrids for which specific class in the show. Remakes of classic hybrids are eligible for benching in this section. If an Australasian species or hybrid is selected as a champion,
 16. they are not eligible for the Bill Murdoch or Ira Butler trophy nominations. The judges will be asked to select an Australian species and hybrid for these trophy nominations.
 17. **Class 12:** This class is only for crosses between species within the *Dendrobium speciosum* complex. (They are eligible to be nominated for the Bill Murdoch Trophy).
 18. First flowering seedling *Dendrobium speciosum* complex must only be benched in **Class 10**.
 19. Perpetual trophies will be awarded to the winner but ANOS Inc. Central Coast Group will retain possession.
 20. **Classes 20, 21, 22 & 23:** Excludes plants with any Phalaenanthe or Spatulata parentage.
 21. Novice Section is open to all ANOS members providing they are Novice growers in their Society.
