D15 *D. teretifolium* 'Maddison Grace' HCC/AOC - Bill Murdoch Silver x *teretifolium* 'Hexham Gold'

Our awarded 'Maddison Grace' which is a late flowering form with an apple green tinge has won multiple show champions along with a Bill Murdoch Silver Certificate and OSNSW Species of the Year crossed with the large flowered gold from 'Hexham Gold'.

F23 *D. Glenn Wall* x *D. Tweetas* 'Red Lip'

Here we have a cross, which has the potential to add a new colour combination to the wide range of those available within section rhizobium. There is no secret, we are on the hunt for orange and if not deep gold flowers with dark red labellum's. These are great growers and should not take long to flower at all.

Get in quick as these will not last long!

F40 *D. Waverley Delight* x *D. teretifolium* 'Shane'

D. Waverley Delight has wonderful shape and is of burnt orange and sunset tones. *D. teretifolium* 'Shane' is a fine example of the species with its cream flowers, larger than normal. Hopefully these flower with lots of colour and lots of large flowers.

F45 *D. Weatherly* x *D. Lauren* 'Holly Chief' AM/AOC HCC-ACC/ANOS – G. Hermon Slade Trophy Winner 2015

Here we have two colourful *D. teretifolium* styled flowers. These plants will produce many large flowers of yellow and sunset tones. Hopefully 'Holly Chief' throws in its ruby labellum along with its award quality shape, substance and texture.

G15 *D. Tweetas* 'KWR' x *D. (striolatum* x Fay Moore)

Here is a cross we sourced from Mr Ken Russell. *D. Tweetas* 'KWR' was champion at the 2010 ANOS Newcastle conference and is a large flower full of colour. Dad is also a large dark flower with a blood red labellum. These beauties are limited and won't last long!

G31 *D. Australian Freckles* 'Best Blue' AM/ANOS-AOC x *D. Australian Sunblessed* 'Judy'

D. Australian Freckles 'Best Blue' is the parent of *D. Oliver Jack* and many other quality hybrids. Awarded in 2016 it has quality rounded segments and is packed full of colour. This particular *D. Australian Sunblessed* is the darkest I have seen (our thanks to Ron Young for the pollen), hopefully the progeny will be strong flowerers and have some very dark colour.

G43 *D. Tweetas* 'Neville' x *D. Martin* 'Gold' HCC/AOC

This is one cross I personally have very high hopes for. *D. Tweetas* 'Neville' has excellent shape and colour, paired here with the 'beefy' *D. Martin* 'Gold'. We are looking for colourful yellows and oranges with outstanding shape. There's no experimentation with this cross, just on a hunt for award quality progeny.

		<p>1002 <i>D. wassellii</i> x <i>D. Hot Coals</i></p> <p>This is the experimental cross of the catalogue! We are looking for short growing and compact plants that flower more than once a year. I'm hopeful that the colour and spray can affect of <i>D. Hot Coals</i> is dominant but only time will tell.</p> <p>Available in 50mm @ \$8</p>
		<p>JD1313 <i>D. Australian Ginger</i> 'Golly' x <i>D. dolichophyllum</i> 'JD Gold'</p> <p>Another from our southern friend Jeanne Dunn, whose hybridisation is nothing short of outstanding. This is a reverse of 2833 and its parents are actually very similar. These should be a large flower, packed with colour and thanks to the influence of <i>D. striolatum</i> the plants shouldn't grow meters long!</p> <p>Available in 50mm @ \$8</p>
	<p>2826 <i>D. fuliginosum</i> x self</p> <p>A selfing of the one and only <i>D. fuliginosum</i> responsible for most of the hybrids we see today with the so-called spray can affect.</p> <p>Available in 50mm @ \$9</p>	
		<p>2884 <i>D. Wickersham</i> = <i>D. Australian Ginger</i> 'Meggs' x <i>D. Lauren</i> 'Holly Chief' AM/AOC</p> <p><i>D. Lauren</i> is a large yellow with bold purple labellum, while this <i>D. Australian Ginger</i> is a monster with pink and purple markings. 'Holly Chief' was Reserve Champion at the 2015 Kempsey Speciosum Spectacular, where it also received two HCC's. We expect large flowers of green and olive tones from this cross with striking labellums. We came across some left overs in the lab and re-worked the mother flask, don't miss out this time around!</p> <p>Available in 80mm @ \$15 VERY, VERY LIMITED</p>
	<p>2917 <i>D. Amphion Callisto</i></p> <p>These plants are some of the strongest growing seedlings we have ever seen. They flower at all times of the year and range from a sandy colour to deep burgundy.</p> <p>Available in 80mm @ \$25 – Flowering Size</p>	
	<p>2972 <i>D. teretifolium</i> 'Buddha' x self</p> <p>A selfing of a white <i>D. teretifolium</i> given to us by the late Brian Abbott. This particular clone has very thick terete leaves and large flowers. The more of this beautiful species we can make available, the less they might 'disappear' from nature. Will grow best mounted on hardwood or cork.</p> <p>Available in 50mm @ \$8</p>	
		<p>2977 <i>D. Australian Ginger</i> 'Wow' HCC/ANOS-AOC AD/AOC x <i>D. Kalon Byrne-Dimos</i> 'Newbold'</p> <p>Again, large and colourful flowers are expected. However, we are hoping to maintain the quality shape and proportioned nature of the clear yellow 'Newbold'. The ginger used in this cross might not have the best shape of the grex, but what it does have is colour.</p> <p>Available in 50mm @ \$8</p>

		<p>2978 <i>D. Tweetas</i> 'Curly Gold' x <i>D. Wickersham</i> 'Genesis'</p> <p>The next generation of yellow hybrids here, looking for purple tones in the labellum and full shape. We used 'Curly Gold' because of its floriferousness and also compact growth habit. 'Genesis' is of course the product of <i>D. Lauren</i> 'Holly Chief' AM/AOC</p> <p>Available in 50mm @ \$8</p>
		<p>2989 <i>D. Harmon</i> 'Mark' x <i>D. Hot Coals</i></p> <p>Our mushroom pinkish-brown Harmon is a relatively large <i>Dendrobium</i>, its white striations and its 30mm plus wide bloom really stand out in spring. It's a very compact plant and its inflorescences are completely upright. We used <i>D. Hot Coals</i> to hopefully inject a fair amount of its brown and red colouration, just for something a bit different.</p> <p>Available in 50mm @ \$8</p>
		<p>3011 <i>D. Tweetie</i> 'Huge' x <i>D. Australian Ginger</i> 'Big Guy'</p> <p>Searching for big and colourful flowers similar to <i>D. Tweetas</i>, however this time with an extra dose of <i>D. fuliginosum</i>. 'Big Guy' is our largest ginger and has an awesome ruffled labellum. These should be good.</p> <p>Available in 50mm @ \$8</p>
		<p>3012 <i>D. Tweetie</i> 'Pie' x <i>D. Martin</i> 'Gold' HCC/AOC</p> <p>The 'beefy' <i>D. Martin</i> 'Gold' has very good shape and it also has an interesting mix of green and gold tones. Here we have match him with 'Pie' to try and achieve a different colouration. Also, by using <i>D. Tweetie</i> there is a chance we will get more than one flowering a year. These should be plants for the show bench.</p> <p>Available in 50mm @ \$8</p>
		<p>3013 <i>D. Sharday</i> = <i>D. chordiforme</i> 'Tumbi' x <i>D. Tweetie</i> 'Pie'</p> <p>The reason I made this cross was to begin a line of breeding, a line of compact plants that flower in the later months of the year, this way we have section rhizobium hybrids in flower all year round. We expect quality shape and colours ranging from yellow to red.</p> <p>Available in 50mm @ \$8</p>

There have been a few plants of the same cross flowered around the country and thanks to 'Dell' they all host a bold burgundy labellum matched by maroon patterning on the segments. 'Daylight Moon' will aid in producing plants with great shape, colour and flower count. 6.3% <i>bigibbum</i> Available in 50mm @ \$8 & 80mm @ \$15</p>
		<p>E29 <i>D. Gillieston Jazz</i> 'Fishing Point' x <i>D. speciosum</i> v. <i>curvicaule</i> 'Daylight Moon' FCC/AOC</p> <p><i>D. Gillieston Jazz</i> 'Fishing Point' is a wonderful starry hybrid with violet purple patterning and a matching labellum we have placed it with "The Moon" to hopefully increase the flower count and beef up the segments just a tad while maintaining the vibrant colours of Mum. 12.5% <i>bigibbum</i> Available in 50mm @ \$8 & 80mm @ \$15</p>
	<p>E30 <i>D. Hunter Cracker</i> = <i>D. Gillieston Jazz</i> 'Fishing Point' x <i>D. Cracker</i> 'Kay'</p> <p><i>D. Gillieston Jazz</i> 'Fishing Point' is a wonderful starry hybrid with violet purple patterning and a matching labellum seen here with <i>D. Cracker</i>, which came from Norm Mitchell's stables we are searching for a wider labellum, striking patterns and intense coloured large flowers. We have flowered a few and they have been similar to <i>D. Brinawa Charm</i>. 12.5% <i>bigibbum</i> Available in 80mm @ \$15</p>	
		<p>E45 <i>D. Brian's Quest</i> 'Genesis' x <i>D. Dunokayla</i> 'Palemoon'</p> <p><i>D. Brian's Quest</i> is a beautifully presented large fading deep pink/purple flower with a bold deeper pink labellum and a flower count of around 20 flowers per raceme! Paired with <i>D. Dunokayla</i> 'Palemoon' the cool Dendrobium champion from the 2013 ANOS Conference. We expect splashes of colour on broad, fleshy segments. 3% <i>bigibbum</i> Available in 80mm @ \$15</p>
		<p>E53 <i>D. Shukri Star</i> 'Genesis' x <i>D. Aussie Starlight</i> 'Hunter'</p> <p>This is our second cross with <i>D. Shukri Star</i> 'Genesis' as the pod parent Its large golden segments with purple outlining are very striking in Spring. However sometimes the flower count can be a little low so we thought our equally patterned <i>D. Aussie starlight</i> 'Hunter' could lend a helping hand and hopefully pass its bold violet labellum. 6.3% <i>bigibbum</i> Available in 50mm @ \$8</p>

Bernie Fletcher has remade D. Jayden for us, using a particular D. Elegant Heart which is absolutely massive in size and which carries an equally impressive labellum. It's not often you see quality remakes of this hybrid done by someone of Bernie's calibre. **12.5% bigibbum**

F52 D. Intice 'Bob' x D. speciosum v. curvicaule 'Daylight Moon' FCC/AOC

We were thinking of a way to get a higher quality, next generation D. Australian Artist style flower and this is our answer. D. Intice 'Bob' isn't the biggest flower but its patterning makes up for that. "The Moon" should help to thicken the segments up and aid in the all-important floral presentation. This cross should produce compact plants with a large display of spring colour. **3% bigibbum**

F71 D. Brinawa Sunset 'Joyce' x D. speciosum v. speciosum 'Rick'

Classic Tropicool™ breeding here with D. Brinawa Sunset, a large starry flower of yellow and pink tropical tones and no shortage of them! Crossed with 'Rick' which is a 'Windermere' selfing. We hope to increase texture and flower count in this cross. **12.5% bigibbum**

D. Peewee is no stranger to our breeding program and we don't think anything can go wrong with this cross. We are searching for D. Brinawa Sunset styled flowers packed full of colour and with the perfect segment shape of YTG. **25% bigibbum**



		<p>G52 <i>D. Bergen</i> 'Melissa' x <i>D. Zip</i> 'JMCM'</p> <p>We have been struggling to get germination with this spectacular <i>D. Bergen</i>, so I gave in and put the ever-fruitful <i>D. Zip</i> on to 'Melissa'. I guess this is seen as a stepping stone hybrid but the results should be some heavily patterned white flowers that are very strong growers. 3% <i>bigibbum</i> Available in 50mm @ \$8</p>
		<p>G53 <i>D. Gillieston Lustre</i> 'F.F' x <i>D. Intense</i> 'Bob'</p> <p>Here we have a very rare cross of two Tropicool's™. 'F.F' is quite a large grower but its flowers are very well balanced and present way above the foliage. While, 'Bob' is parked full of dark purple patterning. We are hoping for large and colourful flowers of good shape. 18.5% <i>bigibbum</i> Available in 50mm @ \$8</p>
		<p>G57 <i>D. Burgundy Bride</i> 'Dell' x <i>D. Sunglow</i> 'Tumbi'</p> <p>'Dell' hosts a bold burgundy labellum matched by maroon patterning on the segments and this labellum seems to carry through into its progeny. Therefore, we paired it with our best <i>D. Sunglow</i> which is known to let colour through. Maybe just maybe we will see some yellows with red labellum's. 6.3% <i>bigibbum</i> Available in 50mm @ \$8</p>
		<p>G61 <i>D. Gillieston Jazz</i> 'Fishing Point' x <i>D. Finale</i> 'Chunks'</p> <p>We are trying to gain intensity of colour, substance and ease of growth in this cross. 		<p>G63 <i>D. Hunter Dream</i> x <i>D. Hunter Titanium</i> 'Jazzy'</p> <p><i>D. Hunter dream</i> has <i>D. Ray's Dream</i> in its parentage and we all know what it has been doing in crosses such as <i>D. Brimbank Fire</i>. I thought this style of breeding would look better with our <i>D. Kayla</i> styled 'Jazzy' instead of another boring <i>D. speciosum</i>. 1.5% <i>bigibbum</i> Available in 50mm @ \$8</p>
		<p>G64 <i>D. Burgundy Bride</i> 'Dell' x <i>D. Hunter Titanium</i> 'Jazzy'</p> <p>'Dell' hosts a bold burgundy labellum matched by maroon patterning on the segments and this labellum seems to carry through into its progeny. Therefore, we paired it with our best <i>D. Kayla</i> styled hybrid. They are attempting to broaden the species in our Tropicool™ hybrids and also aim to intensify the colour. These will be fantastic! 6.3% <i>bigibbum</i> Available in 50mm @ \$10</p>
		<p>G79 <i>D. Stunning</i> 'K.W.R' x <i>D. falcorostrum</i></p> <p><i>D. Stunning</i> has massive flowers and intense colour, matched here with <i>D. falcorostrum</i> as described above. The labellum's should be broad and the colours intense. 6.3% <i>bigibbum</i> Available in 50mm @ \$10</p>
		<p>G80 <i>D. Lorikeet</i> x <i>D. falcorostrum</i></p> <p><i>D. Lorikeet</i> is known for its large starry flowers of deep pink and purple. As above Tony is hoping for intensified colour and improvements in shape. 12.5% <i>bigibbum</i> Available in 50mm @ \$10</p>

		<p>F62 <i>D. (Lynette Banks x Finale)</i> x <i>D. Lochiel</i></p> <p>As you have probably noticed by this point we have been chasing some show bench quality yellows by expanding the gene pool. Here we see Mum of cross F64 with its <i>D. Finale</i> shaped flowers paired with a beautiful example of <i>D. Lochiel</i> that carries numerous rich yellow-gold flowers thanks to the influence of <i>D. speciosum</i>. Available in 50mm @ \$8</p>

		<p>G68 <i>D. Dingadee</i> = <i>D. Amber Banks</i> 'Genesis' x <i>D. Dunokayla</i> 'Palemoon'</p> <p>A remake of an outstanding hybrid. Our <i>D. Amber Banks</i> is a chunky yellow with substance and texture, while 'Palemoon' is a cream beauty which won champion hybrid at the 2013 ANOS conference. We are expecting nothing short of quality. Available in 50mm @ \$10</p>


