Conditions of Entry

1. Displays to be completed in position by 3.00pm.
2. Judging to commence @ 4.45pm
3. The Judges decisions shall be final at all times
4. Entries are free, and open to all financial members of the OSNSW, any Affiliated Orchid Society and ANOS
5. Entries are received on the basis that all care will be taken; however, Mingara Orchid Club Inc. or Mingara Recreation Club Ltd. shall not be responsible for any damage, destruction or loss to such exhibits, and the exhibitor shall have no claim whatsoever against the Mingara Recreation Club, Mingara Orchid Club Inc., its sponsors or any of the Society's or members involved.
6. All Orchids for Judging must be entered with their correct Class details on the form supplied and can be either emailed (preferably) by 8pm Thurs 2nd June moc.editor@gmail.com or handed in **before 1pm**, Friday 24th June.
7. **Any Orchid/s for Judging must be owned and grown by the Exhibitor for at least 6 months prior to the Show.**
8. **All Orchids for Judging to be correctly and clearly labelled so that they can be read from a distance.**
9. **Any Orchids NOT for Judging to be labelled DISPLAY ONLY**
10. All plants exhibited must be healthy and free of pest and diseases. The Show Marshall in consultation with 2 Committee members may reject any plants that appear diseased, and request they be removed from the venue.
11. The Show Marshall reserves the right to add or delete a Class if necessary
12. Judging will be in accordance with the rules as set out by the Mingara Orchid Club Inc. as per this schedule, and / or in accordance with the standards of the AOC and OSNSW Inc.
13. All plants must be easily accessible to the Judges. No displays are to use water in ponds. Nothing is to be attached to the walls in the Tasman Rooms (Display area). Plastic for floor covering will be provided by Mingara Orchid Club Inc.
14. Exhibitors may use ferns, and or foliage plants, to embellish displays, but such plants are not to be considered for judging except for their decorative effect in displays. No flower or fruit other than orchids or Anthuriums or Carnivorous plants may be used in any displays
15. **Miniature** has the following meaning: the flower size not exceeding 15mm across the widest part and a distance of <200mm from 1st to last flower
16. First flowering **seedling** shall mean the complete plant (hybrids and species) raised from seed and flowering for the first time. Mericlones are ineligible. Divisions of plants are ineligible.
17. **Staking** shall be in accordance with the rules of the AOC & OSNSW. Flowers may be supported in the best possible manner for presentation. This support should be in a manner so as not to be obtrusive and distract from the overall beauty and charm of the plant.
 - a. Inflorescences shall not be tied or supported above the lowest flower
 - b. In the case of branching racemes, they shall not be tied or supported above the uppermost branch
 - d. Where plants are tied above the bottom flower or top branch, the Judges are permitted to penalise, or temporarily remove such tie/s for the purpose of judging.
 - e. Ties must be removable. **Cable ties and sticky tapes are not acceptable**
 - f. Points will be deducted for obtrusive and dangerous staking where the stake protrudes above the flowers and large ornamental clips that detract from the floral display
18. **During Judging, those not involved** in the process **must move out of the Tasman Room**. Recorders and/or Runners are to remain a reasonable distance behind the Judges.
19. Novice entries are eligible for Champion prizes.
20. Junior winners are eligible for cash prizemoney for Class places only. Junior Champion will receive a plant, certificate and Sash.
21. An Exhibitor shall not remove plants, an exhibit or part thereof, before the end of the show, without permission of the Show Marshall or Show Committee
22. Societies and/or Exhibitors are responsible for removing all materials used in their displays at the end of the Show
23. The Mingara Orchid Club Inc. or Mingara Recreation Club Ltd reserves the right to photograph, for its own purposes, any exhibit in the show. These may be used for future advertising.
24. **Mingara Club has a Bump in/out procedure. When unloading and loading, vehicles must follow Mingara Club Attendant instructions.** Once unloaded, please move vehicle to any one of the designated parking areas
25. Exhibitors may enter the venue via the 2 side doors of the Showroom, on the main carpark side of the building. This also applies on the Sunday at the closure of the show. A Mingara Parking Attendant will be in attendance.
26. MINGARA is a licensed club and all persons over 18yrs must sign into the licensed Club.

Please note: In relation to judging Grand Champion then Reserve Champion....

When the Grand Champion is selected then the plant to replace that plant on the Champions table can come from **any 1st place in that Section...** Example, if...1st in Oncidiinae Class 27 is awarded Grand Champion, then the best of any other 1st place from the Oncidiinae Hybrids Classes (27-32) are eligible to come onto the Champions table to be considered for Reserve Champion. This applies to all classes.

Judging for Grand and Reserve Champions will be by Secret vote
